Well the most topical point in this update relates to the new mobile phone ban. Our first day for trialling the process was today. I have received a number of request for a student to be allowed to use their mobile phone at school based on a medical reason, specifically a medical exemption. Hopefully this graduated approach to the ban will allow us to resolve any issues that occur before term 4 when the ban is mandated in all schools.
