Another busy week with Year 10 taking part in their first formal exam week and StuVac. The students were fantastic and handled the movement to the three venues extremely well. They were settled in the examination rooms and practised their exam technique, how to manage reading time, which areas of the paper to answer first and other specific strategies for a student including if the student has disability provisions how to manage rest breaks or whatever their provision entails.
