What a great start to the week with Grandparents Morning on Monday. The Year 7 students were exemplary both as an audience and as performers. While the students have only been in high school for a term and a few weeks the quality of the dance, drama and musical performance showed a level of cohesion and professionalism that indicated a longer time together.
