Year 10, 1-4 core classes are all at advanced level based on the students results in science, geography and PDHPE at the end of the previous year. Year 10, 5-8 core classes are at intermediate level again based on Year 9 end of year results.

For Year 9 core classes 1-3 are at advanced level and 4-6 are at intermediate level. Again the level of class a student is in was determined by the end of the previous years results.

All classes in the advanced level are equivalent and all classes at intermediate level are equivalent. We do not have any standard classes in Years 9 and 10.

Exciting news the annual Mosman Art walk is starting this coming week on Thursday 20 February. This is the fifth year of the walk and will be the biggest ever, with fifty retail outlets showcasing artist works. Each work can be purchased through a QR code next to the work on the shop window with 30% supporting Mosman High students and 70% to the artist.
